

Puzzle of Official Trade Gap Rises: China and Myanmar Trade Data




A comparison between the statements of SAC and the General Administration of Customs of China (GACC) shows a **nearly USD 17 billion** gap in the previous 2022-23 financial year. The amount represents illegal trade while showing an increase of almost two times compared to the 2020-21 financial year. As a result, the enlarging gap between Myanmar and China for different financial years indicates a growing amount of illegal trade volume between the two countries in the aftermath of the coup. Except for Thailand, Myanmar is experiencing a decline in trade with three of the four neighbouring countries with cross-border trade routes. China still ranks as the biggest trade partner.



USD 2.7 Billion Increase in Manufacturing Goods Export (October 2020 – March 2023)

Myanmar's export trade value in the 2022-23 financial year was valued at **more than USD 16.6 billion**. Among the exports, manufacturing goods such as sugar, cloths, jewellery, and natural gas were valued at **almost USD 11 billion**, constituting the majority. This amount means an increase of **more than USD 2.7 billion** compared to the 2020-21 financial year. As with mine exports and other goods, agricultural exports declined by **over USD 620 million** compared to the 2020-21 financial year.



More than USD 8 Billion in Border Trade Value

(October 2020 - March 2023)

During the 2022-23 financial year, Myanmar traded with four countries that operate cross-border trading with Myanmar for **more than USD 8 billion**. Myanmar engaged in border trade with Thailand, resulting in a trade value surpassing **USD 5.3 billion**, marking the highest amount exchanged between the two countries. This means a **more than USD one billion** increase compared to the 2020-21 financial year. As the second ranking, the border trade with China was valued at **more than USD 3.1 billion**, representing a decrease of **more than USD 1.9 billion** compared to the 2020-21 financial year.
