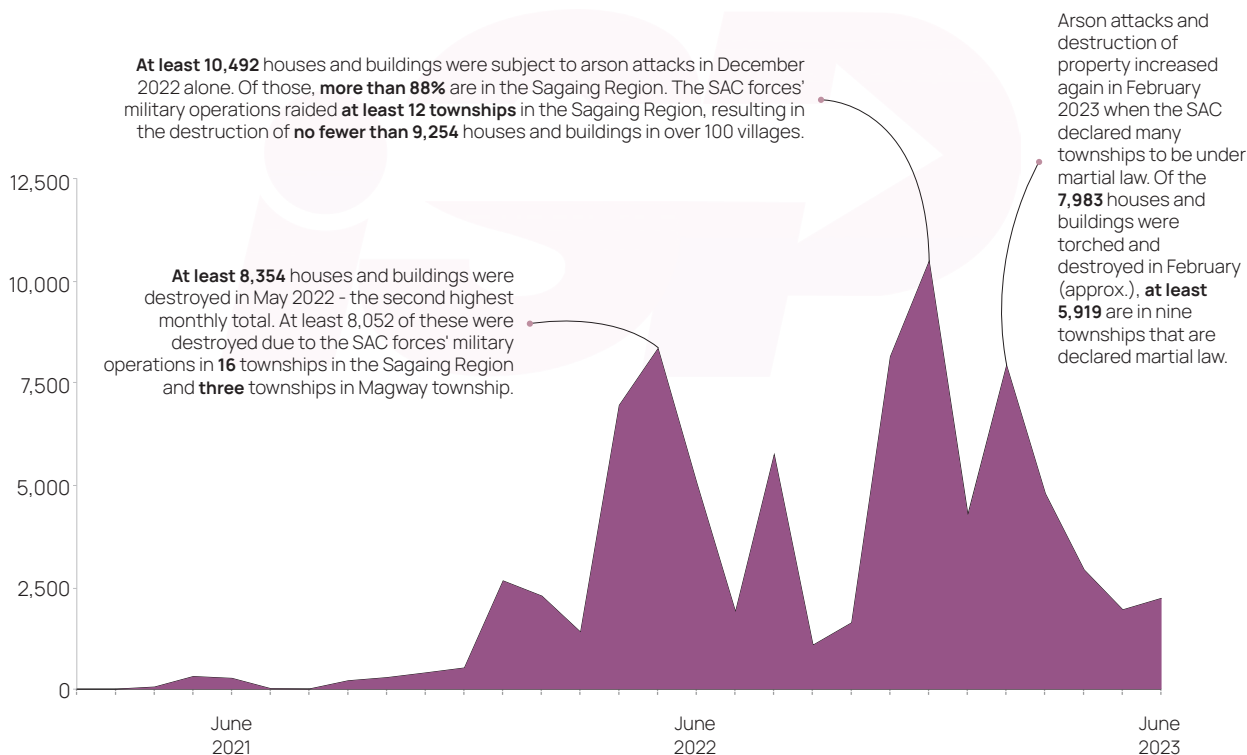


■ Over 24,000 Houses and Buildings Torched and Destroyed in Six Months (February 1, 2021 - June 30, 2023)

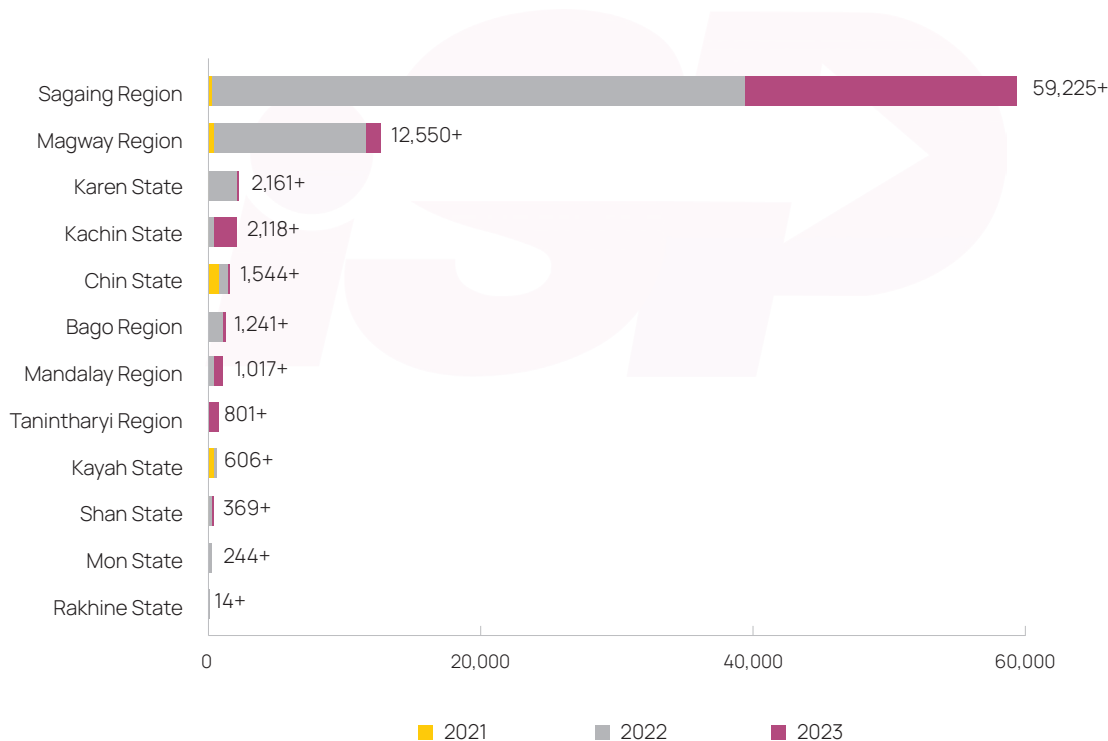
Since the military coup more than two years ago, **at least 81,899** houses and buildings (including religious buildings) have been torched and destroyed in violent clashes. Of those, **at least 24,138** were burned down within the first six months of 2023 - **almost 30%** of the total

■ Over 59,000 Houses and Buildings Torched and Destroyed in the Sagaing Region
(February 1, 2021 - June 30, 2023)

At least 24,138 houses and buildings (including religious buildings) were torched and destroyed during clashes across the country in the first half of 2023. Of that number, **at least 19,732** houses and buildings (over 82%) are located in the Sagaing Region. The Sagaing Region has the highest number of houses and buildings subjected to arson attacks, with **at least 59,225** in the aftermath of the coup.

In the Sagaing Region's Shwebo township, **at least 7,254** houses and buildings were torched and destroyed, which is the highest number since the coup two years ago.

In the Sagaing Region's Depayin township, **at least 6,731** houses and buildings were torched and destroyed, which is the second highest number since the coup two years ago.

■ Houses and Buildings Torched and Destroyed in Over 106 Townships

(February 1, 2021 - June 30, 2023)

In the aftermath of the coup, at least 81,899 houses and buildings were torched and destroyed in **106 townships (about 32%** of the total number townships across the country) in just over two years. In the Sagaing Region, the region that experienced the highest number of arson attacks, property was torched and/or destroyed in 32 townships out of 38 townships in the Region. Furthermore, houses and buildings were torched and destroyed in six out of the seven townships in Karen State, and eight townships out of 10 townships in the Tanintharyi Region.

In the Sagaing Region's Khin-U township, **more than 2,300** houses and buildings were torched and destroyed, which is the highest number within five months.

■ Houses and Buildings Torched and Destroyed in Over 106 Townships

(February 1, 2021 - June 30, 2023)

The number of townships that declared martial law throughout the country has reached **47** since the coup two years ago. Of that number, 25 townships saw **at least 10,185** houses and buildings in total torched and destroyed between February and June 2023. 92% of the houses and buildings torched and destroyed are located in six townships under martial law in the Sagaing Region.
